Swine Exhibitors






All in person classes are held at the Cass County MSU Extension Office at 120 N Broadway, Cassopolis, MI and are at 6:00pm.

Draft Horse Program





Become a volunteer

Parents, do you want to do something extra with your child at their 4-H meeting, or event? Do you have a skill that you would love to share with others? Do you just like to help where-ever there is need? Have you thought about becoming a volunteer??? There are so many ways that you can volunteer in 4-H, head over to https://msu.samaritan.com and start the process to become a volunteer.

Types of Volunteers

Gold Volunteer: These individuals interact with youth and/or adults in meaningful ways on behalf of MSU Extension. This includes providing training, education, leadership or support to MSU Extension offices, programs, events or sub-organizations such as a 4-H club, an Extension Master Gardener class or association.

Silver Volunteer: These individuals have no direct interaction with youth or vulnerable populations and no to low opportunity to form relationships with youth or vulnerable populations on behalf of MSU Extension. Exempt from this rule are those with minimal interaction, such as parking attendants or people handing out ribbons or opening gates (see MSU Extension Volunteer
Definitions for more information regarding roles not requiring screening). Note that a Gold volunteer or MSU Extension employee must be present anytime youth and adults are interacting together and accessible to Silver volunteers at events.

Exploration Days Info

What's It All About?

About 2,000 youth (ages 12-19) and chaperones from across Michigan attend annually.

This fun MSU pre-college program could be the highlight of your summer - it could even change your life!

4-H Exploration Days registration goes from mid-March through April with session assignments made on a first-come, first-served basis. As you select your session choices, be sure to watch for age restrictions! Age requirements for sessions are based on your age as of January 1.

This MSU pre-college program is designed to:

- •Increase responsibility, confidence, independence, accountability, problemsolving, decision-making and time management skills.
- •Increase communication, team-work, citizenship, and leadership skills.
- •Foster ability to meet new people and make new friends from different places and backgrounds.
- •Develop and expand career and personal interests.
- •Increase college exploration and access to the Michigan

State University campus and its resources.

- •Develop social and academic skills needed for a successful transition to college and life as an adult.
- •Give youth opportunities to try things that aren't available in their county.

·What's it like?

- •There'll be more than 100 session choices held on and off campus. You'll choose two or three for your three-day stay.
- •You'll live in a Michigan State University dorm and eat in the cafeteria—just like MSU students do.
- •Sessions are taught by people who know their stuff, including MSU faculty members, 4-H volunteers and staff members and other experts.
- •It's not all sessions! There's plenty of time for fun, including skating, souvenir shopping, exploring, bowling, basketball—even a great dance Thursday night.
- •The 2023 cost is \$220. For more information, please see the <u>Registration Information</u> page.
 - The fee includes meals, a shared room in a dorm, sessions and a tshirt. You may wish to check with your county MSU Extension office to see if scholarship funds are available.
- •Registration opens Tuesday, March 21 at 7pm. Registration books that show all of the sessions and details on everything happening during Exploration Days will be available online and from county Extension offices in March.
- •Registration deadlines (usually the end of April) vary by county, so check with your county MSU Extension office. Don't wait until the deadline though, because popular sessions fill up fast!
- •Contact the 4-H staff in your <u>county MSU Extension office for</u> more information on 4-H Exploration Days, and any specific details pertaining to your county's delegation.

News from Cass County Leaders' Association

For those of you unaware of what Cass County 4-H Leaders' Association does, let's take a moment to explain. Leaders' Association consists of current gold volunteers (leaders) in Cass County, representing each 4-H Club. They meet monthly to come up with new programming ideas and ways to better our county's 4-H program. Through the fundraising that Leaders' Association does, they are able to provide scholarships to state programs like Exploration Days, Citizenship Washington Focus, Capitol Experience, along with senior scholarships, and more. Without the support of our Leaders' Association, there are many things that we would not be able to do.

What can you do to help?

How can you help Leaders' Association? There are a few of ways.

- 1.) If you are a current gold volunteer, ask your club key leader to see if you have club representation at the meetings. If not, volunteer to attend the monthly meetings. They are the 4th Thursday of each month at 6:00pm at the MSU Extension Office at 120 N Broadway in Cassopolis (the old courthouse by the stoplight).
- 2.) If you are NOT a gold or silver volunteer, consider being one. If you don't want to lead but would like to help out at an event they put on, think about becoming a silver volunteer.
- 3.) If you are not sure on becoming a volunteer just yet, the best support you can give to Leaders' Association is to make sure your child is participating in county wide fundraisers and programs that Leaders' Association hosts. If you have any questions, please contact the MSU Extension Office

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards

(13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.
