- Techniques that can be used:
 - Glazed
 - Stained
 - Decal
 - o Overglaze
 - Underglaze
 - Sgraffito
 - Hand-molded Pottery
 - Any Other Not Listed
- Judging Categories
 - o Beginner
 - Stained or glazed projects with limited dry-brushing.
 - Older beginners side by side glazing encouraged along with dry-brushing.
 - o Junior
 - Side by side glazing required using four (4) or more colors.
 - Stained objects must have raised surface or design.
 - Dry-brushing required if appropriate.
 - Senior
 - Use of decorations permitted. Also china paints, fired gold or silver and lusters permitted.

General Rules:

- 1. All projects must start as greenware cleaned by exhibitor restoring detail if necessary. Initials of exhibitors and calendar year that project is exhibited <u>must</u> be carved on bottom.
- 2. A notebook must be kept by exhibitor showing the <u>mandatory Summary Sheet</u> for the current year, as well as all previous years.
 - a. Mandatory Summary Sheet on back of this sheet.
 - b. Failure to keep notebook and Summary Sheets will result in lowering project grade one (1) full grade.
- 3. Within each age grouping, exhibitors must continuously use a technique not previously displaying a progression of more advanced skills.
